Dear Chairman Goodlatte, Ranking Member Conyers, Chairman Marino and Ranking Member Johnson,

The NAA strongly supports H.R. 870, the *Puerto Rico Chapter 9 Uniformity Act of 2015*, which was the subject of a hearing on February 26th before the House Judiciary Committee, Subcommittee on Regulatory Reform, Commercial and Antitrust Law. We respectfully urge you, the leaders of the Committee, to take the next step of scheduling H.R. 870 for a vote and approving it.
